Mission


To cultivate a safe, supportive and nurturing learning environment. To strengthen community one family at a time through connection, quality caregiving, and parenting support.

The Today 'N' Tomorrow Learning Society (TNTLS) has been delivering the Young Parent Program in School District 71 since 1993 when it was originally called Teddies 'N' Toddlers. It is a small not for profit organization whose goal is to support parenting students in completing their high school education. The Society now oversees four initiatives: Today 'N'Tomorrow Young Parent Program, Teddies 'N' Toddlers Childcare Centre (birth–3 years), Lake Trail Childcare Centre (birth –3 years) and, Little Friends Early Learning Centre (3–5years). These programs are accessible to all families with a priority for young parents completing high school and/or college education, those employed and/or families needing assistance through the Ministry of Children and Family Development.

I'm excited to share all the incredible progress and updates in this year's Annual Report.

Every year, we work to strengthen our individualized support for young parents, while continuing to enrich our childcare programming with an EDUCARING approach. At the same time, we strive to be the best employer we can be in the childcare sector. Through this work, we aim to uplift not just families, but the entire Comox Valley community.

A huge highlight this year has been Sharyn Stokes stepping into the full-time role of Lead Supervisor, and progressing to Acting Childcare Manager to cover Rebecca Kleinman's maternity leave. Calling her an asset doesn't begin to cover it—her leadership and consistency have made a tremendous impact. Sharyn continues to meet the diverse needs of our families with care and dedication, all while supporting the organization with her incredible calm approach and consistent mentorship to our team.

We've also deepened our investment in our teachers and programs. From a wide range of workshops to cultural learning experiences, we've grown in areas like mental wellness, team-building, and conflict resolution. Our journey toward truth and reconciliation continues through our ongoing work with Daryle Mills—Night Sun Bear, and the Aboriginal Resource and Referral Network, as well as monthly cultural kits from the Qualicum First Nations, which our team has truly embraced.

This year, we were proud to increase teacher wages and secure additional grants and funding for professional development. We've also continued to support the Board in strategic planning and initiatives that strengthen all our programs and our Society as a whole.

TNTLS Childcare Programs

REBECCA KLEINMAN CHILDCARE MANAGER

It has been another active year for recruitment and staffing, with several outstanding additions to our teaching team. We welcomed six new educators, including one who completed their ECE practicum placement with us, an encouraging reflection of the high-quality training and supportive environment we offer to students pursuing careers in childcare. During the same period, four educators left for various reasons, with an additional three who are currently on maternity leave.

Our Lake Trail Childcare Centre will celebrate its third anniversary this October and is now operating at full capacity, with both programs in the building fully open. Feedback from families continues to be overwhelmingly positive, highlighting the strong relationships our team has fostered with both children and their families. This same standard of excellence is reflected at our Vanier locations, reinforcing that Today 'n' Tomorrow Learning Society remains a leading choice for families seeking high-quality childcare in the Comox Valley.

We remain committed to fostering leadership and professional growth within our team, which has included several updates to our internal management structure. Each of our centre's continuing to benefit from dedicated site supervisors: Amber Ferguson at Little Friends, Rae Schinbein at Teddies and Toddlers, and Jillian Delucry, now the site supervisor at Lake Trail.

A key update to Rae and Jillian's roles is their ability to float between both the infant and toddler programs, rather than being assigned to one while supporting the other. This change has proven to be extremely effective, allowing for more flexible, responsive leadership and ensures more consistent support across both programs.

The introduction of team leader roles at both locations has been highly beneficial. Angela Walker is now the team leader at our Teddies and Toddlers location, while Heidi Parkin fulfills this role at Lake Trail. Both provide valuable support to their respective site supervisors, contributing to the smooth day-to-day operation of each centre. Our site supervisors and team leaders continue to play a vital role in maintaining high standards, both through their leadership and their direct, hands-on involvement on the floor. Their dedication and hard work are deeply appreciated.

In March 2025, I, Sharyn Stokes, stepped into the role of Childcare Manager while Rebecca Kleinman is away on maternity leave. The transition has gone smoothly, thanks to the incredible support of our staff and the thoughtful onboarding process that was in place. I feel truly fortunate about the opportunity to step into this role and to be part of such a supportive, collaborative team that remains deeply focused on working together.

A highlight was our partnership with the Comox Valley Child Development Association to offer the Circle of Security parenting course. The series was well-attended and provided space for our young parents to reflect on their parenting approaches while building connection and community with others navigating similar challenges and milestones.

We were excited to celebrate one young parent reaching a major milestone by obtaining their N driver's license. With public transit in the Comox Valley being limited and often unreliable, access to personal transportation represents a meaningful step toward long-term independence. It opens up the ability to attend school, secure food, access healthcare, and maintain social connection.

Throughout the year we made time to celebrate seasonal holidays, personal milestones, and group accomplishments. These informal gatherings offered moments of levity and joy, but also played an important role in deepening relationships, building peer mentorship, and reinforcing self-worth. By showing up consistently, we're able to create the trust that is necessary to support our young parents as they navigate the complex terrain of early parenthood.

While we didn't have any graduates this year, we saw strong engagement in both the program and in school. Our participants maintained consistent and, in many cases, increased attendance. This contributed to a successful academic year overall. We're proud of the momentum building within the group and look forward to supporting their continued progress toward graduation in the coming year.

Looking ahead, we're excited about the transformation on the horizon as construction begins on the new building that will house a dedicated Young Parent Program room, complete with its very own kitchen. This purpose-built space will give us even more opportunity to foster connection, grow programming, and provide a warm and welcoming environment tailored to the needs of our young families.










